Culpeper Heat Shelter & Fauquier Hope Shelter Discussion	Rev. Green from Fauquier Hope Warming Shelter was not present to provide an overview of the shelter or provide any information on the needs/challenges. Questions regarding when they are open, transportation and intake procedures arose and Jenny Biche will follow up with Rev. Green to gather information and see how FHN can assist. Bill Schlegel from the Culpeper Warming Shelter stated that the shelter has a fixed location at St. Lukes Lutheran Church on the north edge of town rather than shifting to a different church location weekly. Clients can leave their possessions there during the day. Culpeper DSS allows the shelter to use one of their vans. Hours are from 5:30pm to 7:00am. The season ends March 23, 2019. Capacity is 29 and they are unable to accept children. This year they have been staying at capacity so call ahead to confirm a bed is available (540-317-0030 or email culpeperheatshelter@gmail.com). Currently serving 2 pregnant women. Screening is behavior based. Currently 4 people are seeking assistance getting into addiction treatment. No drugs, alcohol or pets are allowed on site. Outreach works best when representatives of service providers and community resources can come to the shelter during the shelter hours of operation, rather than having the clients come to their offices during business hours. 59 different people have been served this year. About 10% dismissed for behavior issues.
